Project Background

Healthy Mother Healthy Child Project is a TY Danjuma Foundation Funded Project being implemented by Antof Rural Resource Development Centre (ARRDEC) in three LGAs namely: Iwok Nsit, odot, Ikot Uyo communities of Nsit Atai LGA, Ibaka, Uda, Okobo-Ebughu communities of Mbo LGA and Oduonim, Edok, Mbokpu Eyoakan Communities of Urue Offong/ Oruko LGA in Akwa Ibom State.

The project is being implemented by ARRDEC under the sub-title, "Promoting uptake of ANC and PMTCT services at 2 PHCs each in Mbo. Nsit Atai and Urueoffong/Oruko LGAs for improved IMNCH in 11 months". and the target populations are

pregnant women and HIV exposed infants. The objective of the Project is to contribute to reducing the prevalence of under-five and maternal mortality in targeted states, therefore to achieve this, the project is working with the beneficiaries, host communities, engaging the various community structures that impact women's care-seeking behaviour to promote uptake of ANC and PMTCT services at the selected Primary healthcare Centres in the project. Resultsfocused activities being implemented included: Sensitization meeting with Community gate keepers, Capacity Building Community-based Outreaches, Health Talk, Cluster Meetings, Meeting with Male Partners, and tracking and follow-up of positive clients.

HIGHLIGHTS OF ACTIVITY-LEVEL RESULTS BETWEEN FEB. TO Nov. 2020

"In February 2020, The project team visited the selected project communities for the purpose of mobilization, sensitization and partnership building all towards achieving the project goal of promoting uptake of ANC and **PMTCT** services at the Primary Health Facilities."

"And sensitization meetings

were held in the same month across the thee LGAs of Mbo, Nsit Atai and Urueoffong/Oruko, with religious leaders, community leaders, women associations and other gate keepers in attendance.

Also, focused-group sessions were held targeting community structures such as traditional birth Attendants, mission home operators etc,"

"Supports of 33 gate**keepers** (16 males, 17 females) were garnered.

Twenty two (22) community structures were interviewed. out of which fifteen were selected to participate in the

capacity building training."

"The pre-project assessment conducted before project commencement revealed that Health System strengthening was key to achieving the project goal. The project's community health systems strengthening activities carried out included capacity building for selected community volunteers, Refreshers Training for Primary Health Centres' workers (PHCWs) and quarterly cluster meetings PHCWs, Traditional birth Attendants, and Mission Homes Operators."

2-Day Refresher Training for Health Workers in 3 PHCs

The Refresher Training held Sept. 2020 was aimed at re-enlightening health workers on ethics, code of conduct, best practices, Focused ANC Care (FANC), sign/symptoms of pre-eclampsia and its management as well as

care of new born.

The Capacity of 35 health

workers comprised of 32females and 3 males was built 3 PHCs across the three LGAs.

Also, the selected PHCs were provided with desk sphygmomanometer, delivery instrument set and stethoscope for

40men had improved knowledge on: the benefits of encouraging their wives for ANC for a minimum of four times before delivery, reproductive health, use of Insecticide Treated Nets (ITNs) in the homes, correct and consistent use of condom, purpose

and need for child spacing
